

The final program requirement involves participation in an internship in which the student has the opportunity to work directly with a certified school counselor.




Candidates seeking Texas Certification in Public Schools must provide all official college transcripts, provide a copy of valid educator certificate, and provide an official teacher service record indicating two years or more of teaching.

Candidates are also required to work with the testing coordinator and be approved prior to testing. Please contact Dr. Paula Manley (pmanley@sagu.edu) for additional information.

Candidates are required to work with the certification officer as well. Please contact Janice Whitaker (jwhitaker@sagu.edu) for additional information.

Candidates will sign and send the Memo of Understanding (MOU), as well as the FERPA Consent agreement before candidates will be allowed to register for courses.
